Meet future health policy statisticians Recap of the HPSS Mentoring Studios 2022

HPSS launched a new program that provides informal research discussions and mentorship studios to student and postdoctoral trainees. Four trainees participated this year and were matched to their respective individual senior mentors one-on-one from outside their personal mentorship networks. Mentors generously volunteered their time and provided advice through informal research and professional mentorships. Each mentor-mentee pair has been meeting over the course of several months to discuss research interests and professional development.

Such mentor-mentee exchanges have been mutually beneficial. In addition, there was a group Mentorship Studio, held on May 10, 2022, where Dr. David Kline (Assistant Professor, Department of Biostatistics and Data Science, Division of Public Health Sciences, Wake Forest University School of Medicine) facilitated a discussion between all four mentees and an esteemed long-time HPSS member, Past-Chair and Secretary, Dr. Kelly H. Zou (Head, Global Medical Analytics and Real World Evidence, Viatrix Inc). The studio entailed a lively discussion that included a brief research presentation by each mentee, followed by an informal and interactive conversation, ranging from multiple topics in research, mentorship, to professional development.
